

THE THIRD MARK OF THE CHURCH:
“I BELIEVE IN ONE, HOLY, CATHOLIC...CHURCH”

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” (Mt. 28:19).

“Catholic” means *universal*. It implies a unity in diversity that expresses the incomprehensible nature of the Holy Trinity.

God predestined *all men* to be saved (1 Tim. 2:4). The Great Commission Jesus gave to the Church in Matthew 28:19 affirms that “*all men are called to this catholic unity of the People of God*” (Catechism, no. 836). There is only One Church. She is Holy and Universal. The Baptized already belong to her. The Unbaptized have a common origin in God and a shared destiny of returning to Him through the efforts of the Church (Mt. 28:19).

A person’s relationship to the Church can be described in one of three ways: First, the Catholic Faithful who are fully united to the Church by all three Bonds of Unity (Catechism, no. 837). Second, the baptized “*who believe in Christ*” but lack the full bonds of unity (Catechism, no. 838). These include baptized Christians such as Orthodox and Protestants. Third, all those who have not yet received Baptism



(Catechism, no. 836-842). Among non-Christians, the Jewish people hold a unique place. They have a partial Bond of Profession of Faith. As God’s Chosen People under the Old Covenant, the Jews are, in a certain way, our older brother in faith (John Paul II, *Visit to the Rome Synagogue*, 1986).

Christians outside full communion with the Church typically lack one or more of the three Bonds of Unity. These bonds are Profession of one Faith, the common celebration of the Sacraments, and submission to legitimate Church authority. The Church seeks to restore whatever Bond is lacking and draw them back into communion and full unity within the Mystical Body of Christ.

Being made in the image and likeness of God, non-Christians possess elements of goodness. The Church considers these elements to be “*a preparation for the Gospel and given by Him Who enlightens all men*” (Catechism, no. 843). They are open doors through which the unbaptized may be brought to truth in Christ, Who is Truth itself (Jn. 14:6).

Diversity encourages unity. That principle summarizes the universal nature of the Catholic Church without diminishing our obligation to make all men disciples of Christ and members of His One, Holy, Catholic Church. It should motivate each of us to replace our biases and prejudices about others who may be different with a heartfelt desire for their salvation; and then treat them accordingly.

ST. BONAVENTURE: on July 15, we celebrate St. Bonaventure, the great Franciscan theologian, and Doctor of the Church. Bonaventure understood that faith is not merely an intellectual exercise but a journey of the heart into the mystery of God's love. Saint Bonaventure was born 1217 and died July 15, 1274. He was canonized April 14, 1482. Saint Bonaventure was a leading medieval theologian, minister general of the Franciscan order, and cardinal bishop of Albano. He wrote several works on the spiritual life and recodified the constitution of his order (1260). He was declared a doctor (teacher) of the church in 1587.
