

RED HATS OF THE CHURCH:

WHO IS A “CARDINAL?”

The cardinals of the Holy Roman Church constitute a special college which provides for the election of the Roman Pontiff according to the norm of special law. The cardinals assist the Roman Pontiff either collegially when they are convoked to deal with questions of major importance, or individually when they help the Roman Pontiff through the various offices they perform, especially in the daily care of the universal Church (Canon 349).

Under normal circumstances, a man who is named a cardinal must already be a bishop or receive episcopal consecration if he is not (Canon 351). Occasionally, the Pope has granted dispensation to remain a priest while still holding the title of cardinal, as occurred in the case of Saint John Henry Newman.

The title of cardinal originally indicated a priest or deacon who held a leadership role in the Diocese of Rome and assisted at papal liturgies. Over time, the duties of the College of Cardinals evolved. Bishops were eventually incorporated into the College and the number of cardinals increased. In the 11th century, the College was given exclusive responsibility for electing the Roman Pontiff (C.f. The Catholic Encyclopedia, *Cardinal*). Today, the College is divided into three categories (orders): Episcopal, Presbyteral, and Diaconal. Being a member of one of these orders in the College does not mean a man is a bishop, priest or deacon. Rather, the three orders represent the historical origins of

priests and deacons being chosen to hold the title, and later bishops. Each order within the College of Cardinals is entrusted with different functions to assist the Pope. Those functions are generally liturgical.



The primary duty of the College of Cardinals is to elect the Pope. When electing a Pope, every cardinal under the age of eighty may participate in the conclave, unless barred by papal order. Those who have already turned eighty may attend preparatory meetings, advise, and assist in administrative decisions, but they cannot enter the conclave or vote (*Universi Dominici Gregis*, 2013). Occasionally, the Pope will call the cardinals to Rome to “deal with questions of major importance” (Canon 349). This is called a *consistory*. During a consistory, the cardinals meet, discuss, and collectively provide advice on whatever topic the Pope has brought forward (Canon 353).

A cardinal wears a scarlet cassock and skullcap (*zucchetto*). The bright red of his vesture represents the Blood of Christ and the sacrifice of the Martyrs. This is a powerful reminder that every cardinal is expected to sacrifice himself for the good of Christ and His Church.

Whenever you see or think of the cardinals, say a prayer for their perseverance in holiness. A man who is a cardinal today may one day be chosen to be Pope. He will need grace and courage to trade his red hat for red slippers.
